## Summary

TIBULLUS, ELEGIAE, I,2,7

Editors of *Tibullus, Elegiae*, I,2,7 should read *ianua difficilis, te densus (densus te R. Helm) uerberet imber* for *ianua difficilis domini/-ae te uerberet imber*. This emendation rids a difficult line of odd sense and ambiguous syntax, supports a pre-existing intertext with Ovid, *Amores*, I,9,15–16, and preserves the anaphoric repetition of *te* in vv. 7–8. The corruption

may be due to a copyist's mistaking *densus* for the familiar *nomina sacra* abbreviation of *dominus*, DNS.
